 and to prevent any disputes that may arise happen my family
 concerning what worldly estate, it hath pleased almighty God
 to bestow upon me do make and ordain this my last will
 and testament in manner and form following first &
 principle, I bequeath my soul to almighty God who gave it
 in hopes of glorious resurrection through the merit & passion of
 our blessed savior Jesus Christ & my body to the earth to be
 buried in christian like manner according to the discretion of
 my executory here after named.
