In the name of God amen I William Merideth of the County of Adair and Commonwealth of Kentucky being at this time of Sound Sense and Memory do hereby constitute and make this my last will as follows (to wit)

In the first place it is my will that my body should be deposited in a Christian manner and that my soul return in peace to God who gave in hope of a glorious resurrection in the second place I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Merideth all of my perishable property such as horses Cattle Sheep and Hogs to make use of and to support and as usual together with all my household furniture I also give to my son Daniel Merideth Ten dollars as also a book called the Arminian Magazine my lands are all ready disposed of in the third place it my desire that my son in Law Leiding Bratcher take care of us all long we live using the stock as occasion may require for support & after the death of the said Rebecca Merideth I should she be the longest liver the residue of the property if any to remain and rest with our care taker after paying what is left to Daniel Merideth in the fourth place the wearing apparel to at the discretion of my wife Rebecca Merideth in testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the nineteenth of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty four. N.B. I have given all my children something prior to this will except my son Daniel for which reason they are excluded from this will.
